DEVOTION TO THE HOLY EUCHARIST

Eucharistic adoration is a popular devotion in the Catholic Church. It is the worship of Jesus Christ who is wholly present in the Eucharist hidden under the appearance of the sacred specie of the bread. Customarily, we expose the Eucharistic Specie in a monstrance for a set period outside the mass for prayer, reflection, and mediation. In our parish, we do this half an hour before weekday masses and conclude it with the rite of blessing with the Eucharist.

You don't need to do much even if you can't concentrate while sitting before the Lord in the Eucharist. Your presence is enough as Jesus appreciates your time being in his presence. Give Jesus your time today and adore his presence in the Holy Eucharist in any Catholic Church.
