**Know your Faith:**

**WHAT IS REQUIRED FOR EARTHLY PEACE?** Earthly peace requires the equal distribution and safeguarding of the goods of persons, free communication among human beings, respect for the dignity of persons and peoples, and the assiduous practice of justice and fraternity.

**WHEN IS IT MORALLY PERMITTED TO USE MILITARY FORCE?** The use of military force is morally justified when the following conditions are present at the same time: - The suffering inflicted by the aggressor must be lasting, grave and certain; - All other peaceful means must have been shown to be ineffective; - There are well founded prospects of success; - The use of arms, especially given the power of modern weapons of mass destruction, must not produce evils graver than the evil to be eliminated.

**WHAT MUST BE DONE TO AVOID WAR?** Because of the evils and injustices that all war brings with it, we must do everything reasonably possible to avoid it. To this end it is particularly important to avoid: the accumulation and sale of arms which are not regulated by the legitimate authorities; all forms of economic and social injustice; ethnic and religious discrimination; envy, mistrust, pride and the spirit of revenge. Everything done to overcome these and other disorders contributes to building up peace and avoiding war.

### ONLINE LUNCHTIME SESSION ON DEMENTIA AWARENESS – Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> August 12 noon 'til 1pm

There are more than 850,000 people living with dementia in the UK today, with 81,000 in the South West. This number is predicted to double in the next 30 years and we will see this reflected in our congregations and communities. All our parishes will know someone living with dementia or caring for someone. You will already be providing pastoral care to people living with dementia and may already be taking steps to be a dementia friendly church.

**This one-hour introductory session is aimed at parish priests, secretaries, eucharistic ministers, pastoral workers and welcomers, members of SVP and all those whose lives are touched by dementia.** It will focus on understanding dementia and the practical aspects of how to respond, but will also offer advice about resources to understand how to accompany those whose lives have been touched by dementia in their spiritual journey. Youth—**Youth Rally**, 23<sup>rd</sup> Sept, 12.00 - 5.00 St Rita's **Honiton**. A Ukrainian family, (mum and two teenage boys), has recently arrived in Tavistock. The initial host accommodation was unsuitable and they have been placed in temporary accommodation. One of the boys has started at Tavi College and mum has recently started work in Tavi and is currently attending one of our churches. It would be fantastic if they could stay in the Tavistock community whilst they need to be out of Ukraine. Accommodation of some kind is needed urgently, ideally within a walk of the town and of Tavi College - this could either be with a host family, possibly just for a couple of months or in rental accommodation. The Council have not been able to offer any further options here - their temporary accommodation is due to end within two weeks and if nothing local is found, they will have to move to another area.
