World Day of the Poor

In this year's celebration we are invited to reflect on the words of Pope Leo XIV's message for the World Day of the Poor the Day and his recent, and first, <a href="Apostolic Exhortation: Dilexi te ("I have loved you"). He reminds us that true faith in Christ cannot be separated from love for those who suffer, and that the Church is called to recognise in the poor not simply recipients of our help, but in some way our teachers in the Gospel. On this day let us open our hearts and our parish life more deeply to the cry of the poor, mindful that in serving them we serve Christ himself.

Prayer for the Day

Loving Father, you gaze with compassion on all who are poor and vulnerable; fill our hearts with your love, that we may see your face in every brother and sister who lacks. Inspire us to a love that reaches out, a faith that acts, and a Church that walks humbly with the poor.
