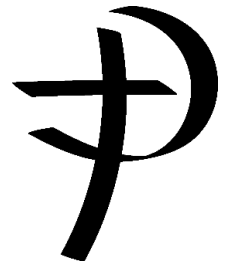

In his message for the 60th World Day of Social Communications, Pope Leo XIV highlights the importance of ensuring that technological innovation, particularly artificial intelligence, serves the human person rather than replacing or diminishing human dignity. In a digital age increasingly shaped by artificial intelligence, he calls us not to lose our capacity to think critically, discern wisely, and relate genuinely. While technology can serve the common good, it must be used responsibly. We are encouraged to resist misinformation, manipulation, and superficial connections, and instead promote communication grounded in **truth, human dignity, and meaningful relationships.**

As we journey towards Pentecost, we remember the Church was universal in its make-up from its very beginning. To mark this Caritas has produced a WELCOME poster to celebrate the 75 languages we have identified being present in our parish communities here in the diocese.
