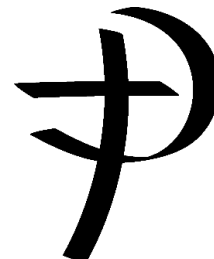

Prevention of modern slavery and recognizing the signs of the potential for exploitation within the community in which we live are critical. Raising awareness of Modern Slavery and the many forms it takes is the first step toward ending this injustice.

## Support for Pensioners on Low Incomes

*An estimated 880,000 low-income pensioner households eligible for pension credit currently fail to claim it and a deadline is approaching. The government says it is worth an average of £3,900 a year, but it is also a gateway to other financial support such as winter fuel payments. If you know a pensioner on a low income, please encourage them to check if they could be eligible for pension credit.
