This year has seen the socalled DIY abortions made permanent in England, Wales, Scotland and Eire, and the continued attempts by the British government to impose abortion on the province of Northern Ireland. In the Republic of Ireland there is concern that the provision of DIY abortions makes it harder to identify coercion and abuse, and GPs are paid more for abortion than for pregnancy care. The attempts to introduce euthanasia and assisted suicide are a continual threat, as are the attempts to further restrict the freedom to speak and witness to life.

Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) Major new SPUC campaign against coerced abortion

Evidence from a recent BBC poll shows that 15% of women have experienced pressure or coercion to have an abortion they did not want. Other polls show a higher percentage. A post-abortive counsellor described coerced abortion as 'one of the most unrecognised and insidious forms of domestic abuse.' The NHS, which funds most abortions states "For consent to be valid, it must be voluntary and informed and the person consenting must have the capacity to make the decision. "Please join us in calling on the Health Minister to commission further urgent research into this abuse and to recognise it as a threat to women's health and wellbeing.
